Teachers need to be able to embed curriculum clarity in their teaching practices to develop assessment literate learners and improve student outcomes.

Curriculum clarity is a way of communicating curriculum intent clearly with teachers, students and parents.

Reliable A-E judgements through practices aligned to the Australian Curriculum or other curriculum document.



Teachers need to be able to articulate in student friendly language:

- the curriculum intent
- what the students need to know and do
- the reading and writing demands

Teachers personally reviewing assessment before teaching a unit of work.

Staff collaboration to create clarity among the team on what students need to know and do in order to be successful.

Build staff capacity of teachers to have sustainable practices at Gladstone State High School

- Work collaboratively to identify what students need to know and do <u>at</u> a 'C' standard and <u>above</u> a 'C' standard.
