### Student Dress Code

Gladstone State High School has a dress code regulated under the Education Act 2006 and is endorsed by the Parents and Citizens Association. The uniform can be purchased from the uniform shop on the GSHS site. To comply with regulations concerning sun protection, hygiene, safety and modesty, as well as promote school pride, students are expected to adhere to the dress code.

NOTE: Students must abide by the Student Code of Conduct expectations at all times when in school uniform or representing the school at approved school events.

**The purpose of the Student Dress Code is to:**

- standardise student dress in order to enhance the cohesiveness of the school community
- present a positive public image of excellence to the community
- provide functional, resilient and economical dress choices for students
- promote student pride in the school community
- comply with regulations concerning safety, hygiene and modesty
- to uphold the traditions of the school colours and logo

**Dress Code Values:**

Students are to ensure the school uniform is clean and not torn/damaged.

(1) Students with a verified disability may wear Velcro shoes – this will be recorded as a PLP on the student record. Shoes not appropriate to wear include Converse, canvas slip on shoes, Doc Martin and other similar style shoes.

Students are **not** permitted to wear:

- Denim shorts, jeans, Denim-like items of clothing, board shorts or rugby league shorts
- Singlets, midriff tops
- Short shorts (short length must be below the reach of the finger tips when hand extended fully down by side)
- Hoodies, beanies or any other items that prevent identification of student from a distance
- Leggings without school shorts over the top
- Any item with pictures, wording and or symbols depicting tobacco, alcohol, drugs or other offensive content
- Other school's uniforms, items of their uniforms or uniforms not permitted under the law (eg police)

Students presenting to school wearing these items will need to contact parents so that an alternate arrangement can be determined. Parents may be asked to provide a replacement item so that students can attend regular classes. Students will not be able to attend classes whilst wearing an impermissible item.

### **Jewellery**

To minimise the possibility of injury the following items only may be worn by students:

- A watch (refer to the *Mobile Phone and Device policy* for limitations)
- Small, plain gold or silver studs or sleepers for all body piercings (sleeper size must not exceed 8mm in diameter)
- Students may wear a fine gold or silver necklace that is below the school shirt and not visible
- One plain flat ring
- An approved medic alert (bracelet or necklace)
- Cultural or Religious items may be worn below the school uniform and must not be visible

All items outside these guidelines are prohibited. If students choose to wear prohibited items they will be required to remove the item/s and place in a safe place in their school bag where the items are to remain until the student arrives at home. Students may also be required to hand the items into the front office for collection after school for non-compliance with this policy. Non-compliance with these guidelines will result in a 20 minute detention.

### **Personal Appearance**

Makeup: Skin coloured lotions/foundations may be worn to cover scars, birthmarks and acne. No other makeup is to be worn. If makeup is worn that is not skin coloured, the student will be required to remove the makeup.

Hair colour and style: students' hair is to be natural tones. Style cuts and colours deemed by the Principal to be extreme or likely to negatively impact on the intent of the Student Dress Code are not permitted. Long hair is to be tied back in all practical subjects or where practical components are being completed (including but not limited to Science experiments/demonstrations, Home Economics cooking lessons and Woodwork, Metalwork, Furnishing, Engineering Skills).

Tattoos – permanent or semi-permanent: Students who have permanent or semi-permanent tattoos must have them covered when in school uniform or participating in school events.

Fingernails should be an appropriate length (minimise the risk of injury to self or others). Nail polishes must be neutral and natural. Exemptions to this may be applied for through the Year Level Deputy Principal for special events such as the Senior Formal.

### **Out of Uniform Days**

Out of uniform days will be advertised on the school calendar and student notices with the identified theme. Students who do not wish to dress according to the theme of the day are to wear school uniform. Students must only wear shoes approved as per the school footwear policy (laces and cover the whole foot). Shirts must have sleeves covering the shoulders and a collar. Short shorts, skirts, leggings without shorts, hoodies, bare midriffs or inappropriate content on items of clothing are not permitted on these days. Denim and board short are permitted on these days. **Swimming Carnival days:** In alignment with sun safe practices, students are to wear a sun shirt and board shorts at all times unless competing in an event.

### **Students out of uniform**

- Students who are unable to wear the uniform on a given day for a legitimate reason must bring a note from their parent/carer explaining the circumstances.
- Students who are out of uniform must wear clothes that are as close as possible to the school uniform.
- The student's Care Teacher will complete an Exemption Slip and record it on IDWeb.
- If a student arrives late to school, after signing in at the office, they must request an out of uniform Exemption Slip, then go to class.
- If a student does not bring a note, they will be issued with a Detention for one half of one break to be completed with the Year Coordinator.
- Throughout the day if a student cannot show an Exemption Slip when asked it will be entered on IDWeb. The student will be issued with a lunch detention for not having a valid reason with a note from home.
- If wearing an item/s inconsistent with the Student Dress Code Policy the student will be sent to the Administration Building where the parent/carer will be contacted and requested to bring the correct uniform. If a parent or carer is unavailable the student will be provided with a loan item for the day.

### **Student Planners**

This student planner is considered part of the school uniform. It is designed to help students organise their homework and study time effectively. Students must:

- Maintain their planner in a presentable state all year round
- Have their planner out for every care class, parade and lesson
- Write all homework into the planner prior to leaving class
- Record all due dates for assessment items – assignments and exams
- Plan and note preparation time for assignments and exam revision
- Develop and revise their Personal Learning Goals for each subject at the end of a unit of work
- Write in/record any appointments they have
- Record and monitor attendance each fortnight.

The planner may be viewed regularly by parents, teachers, Year Coordinators, Heads of Department and Senior Executive staff to check that homework, assignments, subject profiles and any other work is recorded. The planner is to be kept in a neat and tidy state all year and contain school information only. Pictures, graffiti or written communication to other students is not to be entered into this planner. Students who do not comply will be required to purchase a new school planner at their own expense. In the event that a student loses their planner, they are required to purchase a replacement within 7 days.

### **Uniform Shop**

Samples are available for students to try on for sizing at the Uniform Shop located in T Block. Orders may be placed at any time and will be available for collection at the Uniform Shop during the following times:

Monday and Friday 8.15 to 11.15am and on Wednesday 11am to 2pm.

The Uniform Shop operates extended hours at the start of each term and over the Year 6 transition days. Days and opening hours will be advertised via the newsletter and school Facebook page.

### **Education Act (2006) Article 360 Development of dress code**

(1) A State school's principal may develop a dress code for the school's students that is to apply when the students are attending, or representing, the school.

(2) The dress code may provide for the following— (a) standards of what is acceptable in relation to the clothing worn by the students, including headwear and footwear;

(b) Standards of what is acceptable in relation to other aspects of the personal presentation of the students.
