Sic Itur Ad Astra

The motto of Gladstone State High School is 'Sic Itur Ad Astra', translated from the latin phrase Macte animo ... sic itur ad astra 'Be of courage ... thus is the way to the stars'. The School often paraphrases the motto as 'Reach for the Stars'.

The motto appears on the school badge. Recent research has revealed that the earliest use of the phrase appears in Virgil's Aeneid, Book IX, wherin the latin phrase reads 'macte nova virtute, puer, sicitur ad astra'. David West, for example, translates the context of the fuller phrase as: 'You have become a young man lulus, we salute you! This is the way that leads to the stars'.

Essentially, the youthful God, Apollo is addressing young Iulus (also called Ascanius, the son of Aeneas), who has just used his bow for the first time in battle and been blessed by Jupiter with a victory. Hence, this is the way to go on to further success and his destiny. A literal translation of the motto is: Blessing (macte) on your new bravery (nova virtute), boy! (puer). In this way (sic) go forth (itur) to the stars (ad astra)!.

SCHOOL OPERATION

Absences

Early Departures

If you know in advance that your child has to leave school early, please ensure that this is pre-arranged with the office as early as possible on the day. Prior notice prevents delays in departure, as students will not be released from class without a note or a leave pass. Please send your child to school with a note or phone the office as early as possible in the morning.

Late Arrivals

In the case of late arrival, a note or phone call of explanation is required.

Upon arrival a late slip is provided to your child to enter the classroom.

All students arriving late without explanation will have this late arrival documented as a partial unexplained absence with follow up from their Year Coordinator or the relevant Head of Year.

Illness

Unwell students should present to sick-bay for contact home to be made, before school or during break times.

iPad AND BYOD PROGRAMS





Curriculum programs across Years 7 to 12 at Gladstone State High School rely on digital pedagogy. We believe it is essential for all students to actively participate in their learning and that it is imperative to embed technology to transform such learning. Our curriculum is specifically designed for students to engage in authentic learning experiences focusing on collaboration, creativity, critical thinking and embedding information and communication technologies across all subjects, including feedback and assessment collaboration with others.

Two programs exist at Gladstone State High School to support digital teaching and learning:

iPad Loan Program (required for students in Years 7 to 9 in 2024). Gladstone SHS started our iPad journey in 2022 and it will continue to arow into 2024 and beyond.

- There are three options: you may purchase your own iPad and we connect it to the school network, you can rent and iPad from GSHS for \$80 a term, or there is our financial hardship option. For more information on iPads options, please refer to the 2024 Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Charter agreement in your enrolment pack.
- BYOD (optional to students in year 10-12 in 2024) Compatible BYOD devices are able to be brought into the school and connected to the school's network.

iPad Specifications

The following is required for Year 7, 8 and 9 students for the BYOD program.

- Protective case with a built in keyboard e.g. Logitech Slim Folio Keyboard Case with Bluetooth.
- Stylus / Apple Pencil

Note: all devices must meet minimum requirements. See BYOD Charter Agreement.

ONLINE SAFETY - STYMIE

Stymie encourages students and bystanders to send anonymous notifications to Gladstone State High School, about someone who they believe is being bullied or harmed. The notification interface allows bystanders to upload evidence (e.g. screen shots of Facebook discussions, Snapchats, text messages or instant message conversations) and an outline of the incident/s. Stymie complements Gladstone State High School's existing student wellbeing and pastoral care framework. Gladstone State High School encourages our students to use Stymie to report other types of concerns they may have, in support of their peers. FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What sporting opportunities will my child have, and how do they become involved?

Gladstone State High School (GSHS) students are involved in the school swimming carnival, athletics carnival, and cross country events during the year. Students go to their House Coordinators to sign up for events. Other sporting opportunities heavily promoted are Port Curtis trials for students to attend. These will appear in Student Notices which are read each morning during Care Class (the lesson which goes for ten minutes at the start of each day to mark rolls). Gladstone SHS is also a Volleyball School of Excellence school. Students who are eager to try Volleyball should contact the Volleyball Coordinator in the HPE staffroom. Throughout the students' time at GSHS, they may also get opportunities to participate in Rod Dahl Rugby League competition with other local schools and All Schools Touch in Brisbane.

Q: What Music/Arts opportunities will my child have?

If your child is already involved in instrumental music in primary school, then their lessons will continue with our Instrumental Music (IM) teachers in high school. If you would like to start IM, please contact the Instrumental Music Coordinator in the Arts staffroom. In addition to instrumental music (and associated bands and string ensembles), students also have the opportunity to join the vocal group at lunchtime. Each year Gladstone State High School has a Showcase event where visual art pieces are displayed and performances in drama, dance and music are presented. Every two years we also put on a school musical. Our teachers and students are also heavily involved in the combined school musical.

Q: What is the Student Resource Scheme? How do I pay?

The Student Resource Scheme (SRS) is a cost effective alternative to purchasing textbooks and other materials, and is supported by our P&C. Further information on this scheme is included in this booklet. It includes textbooks, student resources and class materials (in lieu of textbooks), student reference material, access to sports equipment, printing, science experiments, etc. It does not include excursions, camps, sporting events, student stationery, excess personal photocopying/printing, outsourced course fees or licences, or individual subject fees covering cost of materials used to complete class activities and projects. Payment of the SRS fee may be made in one payment, or in a series of negotiated payments on a payment plan. Invoices are sent via email at the start of each school year.

Q: Can my child bring their mobile phone to school?

Yes, students are allowed to bring mobile phones to school. During class time, phones are required to be off and away. Off and Away means phones either turned off or on airplane mode during class. Phones need to be out of sight and not used as a clock, calculator, etc. At lunch breaks students may use their phone but we highly encourage students to socialise and interact with their friends during this time. If phones are used during class time, the teacher will ask your student to take it to the office to hand in. The Head of Year will follow up with a consequence. As with any personal device, bringing a phone to school is at the student's own risk.

UNIFORM INFORMATION

The P&C, with school cooperation, have made a decision that Gladstone State High School is a uniform school to ensure that students are easily identified while at school and are safe on the way to and from school.

Everyday Uniform

The school's Uniform Shop provides a selection of styles for students to choose from. The school shirt and navy shorts with a logo are required as the everyday uniform. A formal school uniform is also available from our uniform shop.

Students are required to wear white or black socks.

Winter Uniform

Students may wear a monogrammed school jacket or jumper, long navy pants or plain navy track pants during cooler days. Students may choose to wear black or navy tights, however, these MUST be worn under school shorts or skirts. Tights are not acceptable as a 'wear-alone' option.

Students are not permitted to wear:

- Denim shorts, jeans, denim-like items of clothing, board shorts or rugby league
- Singlets, midriff tops
- Hoodies, beanies or any other items that prevent identification of student
- Any item with pictures, wording and or symbols depicting tobacco, alcohol, drugs or other offensive content

WHOLE SCHOOL REWARDS

Online Reward System

At Gladstone SHS, student achievements and effort are recognised through rewards. These might be for classwork/homework, high attendance, excellent behaviour, punctuality and valuable contributions to school life. Students who make a real effort to improve in learning and behaviour will be rewarded.

Every Student Planner is equipped with Recognition Cards, so students can earn stamps for following our four school values. There are weekly draws for Tuckshop Vouchers, instant exchange for ice blocks from the PBL Cart and eligibility for PBL events that occur twice a term.

PBL REWARDS DAYS

Mid Term and in the last week of every term, Gladstone SHS organises a PBL event for eligible students. In order to participate, students need over 90% attendance, no more than 3 behaviour incidents and no uniform/planner infringements.

DP Inclusion

The goal for our school is to promote an inclusive culture for all students, ensuring the needs of every child are catered for. This aligns with State and Federal policies including the Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) and the Disability Standards for Education (DSE). The Special Education Program (SEP) supports students with a variety of disabilities including students with Autism Spectrum Disorder, Intellectual Disability, Speech and Language Impairment as well as Hearing, Visual and/or Physical Disabilities. We have approximately 120 students with a variety of verified disabilities within the school. In addition to this, the SEP investigates and makes decisions around support strategies for many students who are not verified, yet require significant adjustments to achieve success at school.

Case Managers

To enhance their personal development, some students with significant needs may have access to a Junior or Senior Case Manager. The Case Manager's role is to advocate and support the student to achieve their potential whilst at school. The Case Manager will coordinate meetings, monitor students' achievements and needs. The Case Manager will ensure that the student is aware of accessing the support services and strategies that promote their success at school.

Outside Agencies & Opportunities

Gladstone State High School is involved with many outside agencies. These partnerships enable us to offer a greater range of learning opportunities for our students. It also connects students with programs that can support students during their schooling and post-school. Partnerships with many outside agencies are vital for students with disabilities as the National Disability Insurance Scheme is now able to be accessed in Gladstone.

Multiclass Athletes

Students who have been classified as a multiclass athlete (previously known as AWD Athlete with a Disability) are entitled to participate in sporting events with other students with a disability. We have a number of students who are successful at Regional, State and Australian representative levels. This is an excellent opportunity for students who are interested in sporting opportunities to be part of a team and achieve great success.

Mainstream Access & Support

The primary focus for support teachers and leaders of the Inclusive Team is to work alongside students, caregivers, teachers and the community in a collaborative manner to provide high quality education programs that increase an individual student's success. Some students are assisted in mainstream classes by teacher aides and learning enhancement teachers. The Inclusive Team meet regularly with a variety of stakeholders to ensure successful outcomes for all students and to promote a culture of inclusion.

Year 6 - 7 Transition Program

A Transition Program is organised for each student. This program is vital for ensuring students build a rapport with members of staff who will be supporting them during their high schooling years. It also gives us an opportunity to determine how best to support each student. At times, it is necessary to provide an individualised program for some students and this can be designed in collaboration with Gladstone State High School staff, the child's primary school staff and parents or caregivers. Parents/Caregivers are highly encouraged to make a meeting with the Deputy Principal of Inclusion during Term 3 and 4, if they have a child with a disability enrolling in the following year.

DEADLY CHOICES:

Deadly Choices is an Indigenous Health Education Program that focuses on building students' understanding of health topics that could have a devastating effect on the body. Issues such as smoking, alcohol, drugs and healthy eating are topics studied during this program. This program runs for one semester and has a different topic in each term. All students within the Year 8 and Year 9 cohort, are invited to attend by returning a permission note. Students will attend this program in place of 1 lesson per week.

SCHOLARSHIPS & AWARDS:

There are a variety of scholarships that are available for eligible students such as QATSIF (Queensland Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Foundation), ATSIAP (Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Aspirations Program) and PCCC (Port Curtis Coral Coast). In addition to this there are also a number of prestigious School Awards that students can aim to achieve.

RECONCILIATION

The reconciliation theme is unpacked with all students of the school community through a variety of ways each year. Some of this may include quizzes, hands-on activities, Elder & Community talks or presentations, videos from our student leaders and sharing of cultural artefacts or performances.

NAIDOC

During NAIDOC week we have a variety of activities for all students to be involved in such as competitions, a Touch Football Tournament, Boomerang Throwing, Indigenous Games and Murri Munch on the Oval. We also have some formal events such as our NAIDOC Assembly run by our Indigenous Leaders and our Elders' Morning Tea. We finalise our week with a Traditional Kupmurri meal and gathering.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Leadership opportunities are available within both the Senior and Junior Student Councils. Our Indigenous leaders are responsible for supporting a number of our Indigenous events including NAIDOC Reconciliation Week, School Assemblies, the Transition Program and QATSIF Presentation just to name a few. They are also responsible for supporting students who may need their assistance from time to time and to direct them to the support services that they may require.

TRANSITION PROGRAM

Year 6 students from our feeder schools are involved in a transition program where they visit our school for three morning sessions. Here they engage in a number of activities that prepare them for what their high school life will be like when they start the following year. This is a valuable opportunity for us to meet all the incoming Indigenous students and for them to know what opportunities are on offer to them in high school.



EXTRA CURRICULAR OPPORTUNITIES

Gladstone State High School offers Years 7 to 12 students a variety of extra curricular opportunities

Rugby League

Students will have the opportunity to join our Rugby League teams. We have teams in various competitions including competing for the Rod Dahl Shield. Training occurs at school under the supervision of our HPE staff and coaches. Students need to display behaviour that abides by our Student Code of Conduct to represent Gladstone SHS in sport.



Volleyball School of Excellence

The home of 'The Sharks' our Volleyball School of Excellence (SOE) teams, are a wonderful display of teamwork and mateship. Students train before and after school and compete in different state and national competitions throughout the year. Guided by our knowledgeable staff and trainers, students have the opportunity to learn skills in Volleyball and develop teamwork skills along the way. 
The Arts

SUBJECT INFORMATION

Students at Gladstone State High School have the opportunity to study a broad range of subjects. The format for each year level is slightly different, in line with National Curriculum and/or QCAA guidelines.

Year 7

Core: English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Health and Physical Education (semester) and Japanese (semester). Electives: Students will rotate through elective subjects on a term by term basis. This will allow all students to have experience in one or more areas of The Arts and/or Technology curriculum areas.

Year 8

Core: English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Health and Physical Education

Electives: Students will have the opportunity to rotate through and have access to specialise in 4 elective subjects that will run on a term basis. These electives will cover subjects in The Arts, Technology and Japanese Language.

Year 9:

Core: English, Mathematics, Science, Humanities, Health and Physical Education

Electives: Students will study a range of chosen electives . These electives will cover subjects in The Arts, Technology and Japanese Language. These electives will run for a semester.

Year 10

Core: English, Mathematics and Science

Electives: Students get to expand their academic pathway to begin to specialise in subjects areas as preparation for their senior pathway. Students will study 3 elective subjects from any area they wish.

Year 11 and 12

Core: English and Mathematics (at appropriate level)

Electives: Students will have the opportunity to study 4 elective subjects that will relate to their future career paths. This will be done on a 'lined' basis with students electing one subject per line. Students will also have the opportunity to explore TAFE at School options and School Based Apprenticeships and Traineeships.
